Rye "Y" Swimmers Beat New Rochelle

The Rye YMCA swim team defeated the New Rochelle "Y" team by 142-77 at the Huguenot YMCA pool for its ninth victory of the season.

Bill Stanley captured the butterfly, setting a new pool record of 20.3, and breaststroke while Larry Selig won a freestyle and backstroke.

Record breaking time in the butterfly highlighted the meet as three of the four races produced pool standards. Besides Stanley's effort, Kevin Heller of Rye clinched the 10-and-under in 33.2 and New Rochelle's Paul Coleman set a 1:01.4 mark in the 14-an-under event.

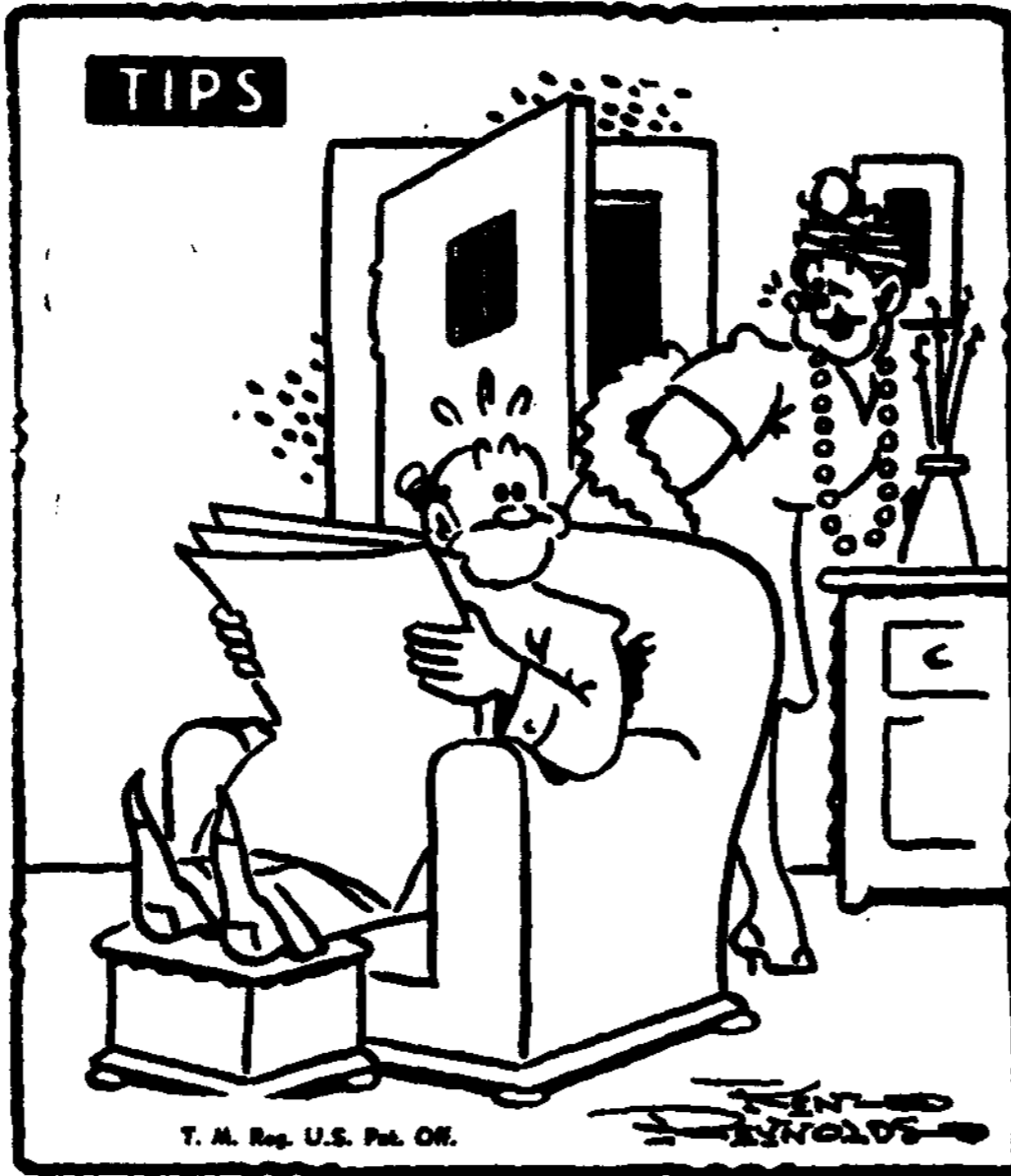
