

Paulist Priest Speaking To Rye Church Women

The Rev. Joseph V. Gallagher, C. S. P., director of the Paulist Institute for Religious Research, will be the guest speaker on World Community Day, Monday, Nov. 6, at 8:30 p.m. in the Parish Hall of the Church of the Resurrection, sponsored by the Rye Council of Church Women, United.

Father Gallagher will speak on the work of the Paulist Fathers, the first body of Catholic priests to be founded in the United States. This group of 262 members strives in their work to preserve, encourage and utilize all that is best in the American culture, especially the American love of freedom and high regard for human dignity. He directs the department of the Paulist Fathers concerned with research and development in religious education and mission.

He is a visiting lecturer at several Roman Catholic seminaries and has written materials and articles in the field of adult catechetics. Father Gallagher has also been very active in the movement of Christian unity. He is a staff member of the Catholic Bishops' Commission for Ecumenical Affairs and a member of the Consultation on Prayer for Unity.

A native New Yorker and World War II veteran, Father Gallagher was a practising lawyer before being ordained to the priesthood.

The Rev. James T. McGuire, Church of the Resurrection, and the Rev. James B. Simpson, Christ's Church, Episcopal, will conduct the devotions.

Refreshments will follow the program. The community of Rye is invited to attend this affair.
