

Rye High School Thespians Staging "Damn Yankees"

Rehearsals for "Damn Yankees," Rye High School's seventh consecutive spring musical, have been underway for three weeks. The production, sponsored by the Curtain Going Up Club and the Music Department, will be performed on April 22, 23 and 24 in the high school auditorium. Directors are James R. Russell and Eugene Weaver.

6th Chapter Civilisation Being Shown Sunday At Presbyterian Church . .

"Protest" and "Communication", key words in present day concerns, also dominate post-Renaissance Europe, when civilized values were questioned and defied. Explored in chapter six of the Civilisation series shown at Rye Presbyterian Church Sunday at 8 p.m., the works of Holbein, Durer, Montaigne and Shakespeare emerge from confusion and restlessness to give birth to expanded powers of thought and expression.

A striking parallel of today's cult-groups is found in the fashion and dress of Durer's "Self-Portrait." And as modern man is preoccupied with psychological developments, so Durer dwells on the human psyche, giving it expression in his engravings and woodcuts. Amidst the tumult of religious strife of the period, Montaigne invented the essay, communicating his thoughts on truth and human values to the millions. Profoundly influenced by these essays, Shakespeare embodied their philosophy in his writings, giving them the dramatic communication of the stage.

The book "Civilisation", which is the film scripts in printed form, has been readied for circulation in the Presbyterian Church library. The Women's Association of the church gave the book to honor the memory of Mrs. Clifton Watts, whose many talents and deep devotion extended to countless endeavors of both church and community.

Harrison Federal And Loan Office Observing 10th Anniversary

The Harrison Office of the Mamaroneck Federal Savings and Loan Association, 389 Halstead Ave., Harrison will celebrate its 10th anniversary on April 1, according to Fred T. Wilson, president.

Savings of a little more than \$750,000 by the end of the first year seem relatively small compared to the present which is over \$12,100,000 and represents approximately one-third of the Association's total assets of 38 million dollars. Interest rates have also climbed from 3 1/2 percent per annum to the present rate of 5 percent per annum from day of deposit to day of withdrawal, compounded and paid quarterly.

Since the Harrison opening, over 400 mortgage loans have been made totaling more than 10 million dollars in the Harrison, Rye and Port Chester areas. Also, more than 2.6 million dollars in interest has been credited to depositors at the Harrison Office during the same period.

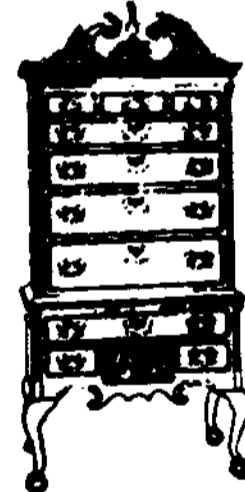
