

Gary Player Will Compete In Golf Classic Tourney

Gary Player's entry in the \$20,000 Westchester Classic rounds out the greatest array of international talent to compete in a PGA tournament," it was announced today by Frank Donahue, vice chairman of the world's richest golf tournament, which will be played at the Westchester Country Club, August 24 - 27.

South Africa's Gary Player is one of only four players in history to have won the cycle of golf — the British and U. S. Opens, Masters and national PGA. Three of the players are now entered in the Westchester Classic—Player, Nicklaus and Sarazen. Ben Hogan is the fourth player to make the cycle.

Player heads a great foreign field which includes British Open champion Roberto de Vicenzo of Argentina; 22-year-old Tony Jacklin of the British Ryder Cup team; Bob Charles of New Zealand; the only left-hander to win the British Open; George Knudson, winner of the International Trophy; and Australian stars Bruce Devlin, Bruce Crampton and Kel Nagle.

Among the field of 144 players competing for the \$50,000 first prize will be every winner on the 1967 PGA tournament program, including U. S. Open champion Jack Nicklaus, Masters champion Gay Brewer, and PGA champion Don January, along with all-time money winner Arnold Palmer and all members of the 1967 U. S. Ryder Cup team.

The Westchester Classic is sponsored by Eastern Airlines in association with the Twig Organizations and Building Fund of United Hospital. It is co-sponsored by the Professional Golfers' Association of America.

The Classic is expected to raise over \$500,000 for the seven participating Westchester County hospitals.

DA NANG, Vietnam (FHTNC) Aug. 4 — Navy Reserve Lieutenant (Junior Grade) Francis Peters, son of Mr. and Mrs. Francis Peters, Jr. of 61 Midland Avenue, Rye, N. Y., has reported for duty at the Naval Support Activity in Da Nang, Vietnam.

The activity was established to meet increased requirements for combat logistic support of operations in Vietnam. Approximately 8,000 Navy officers and men are being assigned to the activity.

Their tasks will include off-loading ships at the port city of Da Nang and over beaches in the demilitarized zone in the north and Chu Lai in the south. Cargo handled include supplies ranging from razor blades to roadgraders, aircraft fuel and lubricants and provisions of all kinds.
